Why is it important for Buddhists to come together?


How important is friendship?

Looking inwards: What does the NBO do?

The NBO has been working since 1993 to promote fellowship and dialogue between UK Buddhists of all traditions and schools and to create opportunities for co-operation.

Looking outwards: The NBO's external work

The NBO has been working for many years in areas such as education, interfaith, chaplaincy and international Buddhist exchange, as well as offering a Buddhist voice on human rights and peace work.

Healthcare chaplaincy

The Buddhist Healthcare Chaplaincy Group has been very successful in making Buddhist chaplaincy available to those who need it in hospital and other healthcare settings and also in developing training and endorsement of Buddhist Healthcare Chaplains.

Buddhist Action Month

Buddhist Action Month (BAM) is an NBO-inspired (and growing) annual festival of Buddhist-inspired social action, bringing together Buddhists from around the UK and and other countries. Every June, we encourage Buddhist traditions to put on events and activities related to social change. Themes include peace work, the environment and global warming and social justice.

European Buddhist Union

The NBO is a member of the European Buddhist Union, offering an opportunity for friendship and co-operation with Buddhists across Europe. The EBU works actively with European political institutions and provides a forum for international Buddhist exchange.

Education

Our education group works with the Religious Education Council and other groups to improve and support the teaching of Buddhism in schools.
